

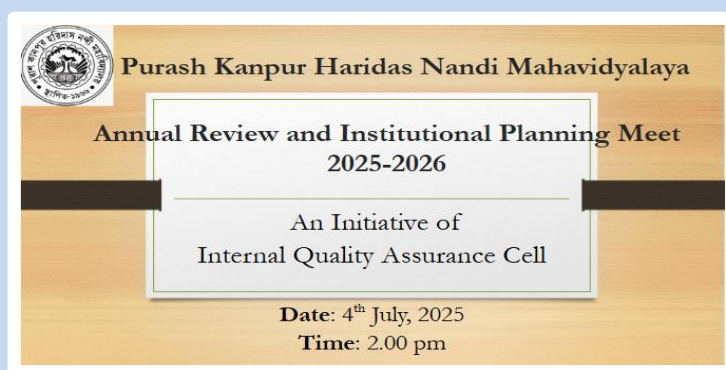

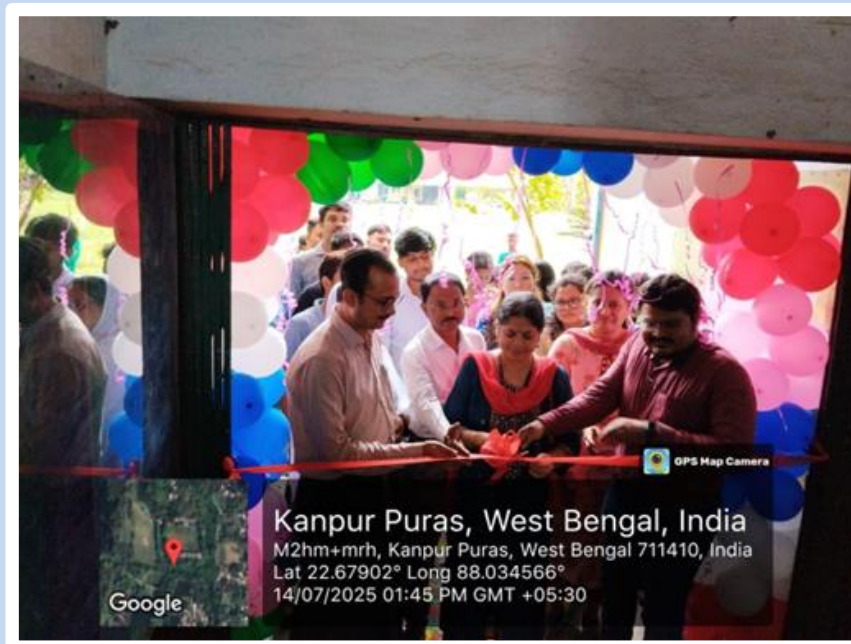

successful completion, participants will gain valuable skills that enhance their job opportunities and prepare them for a brighter future.



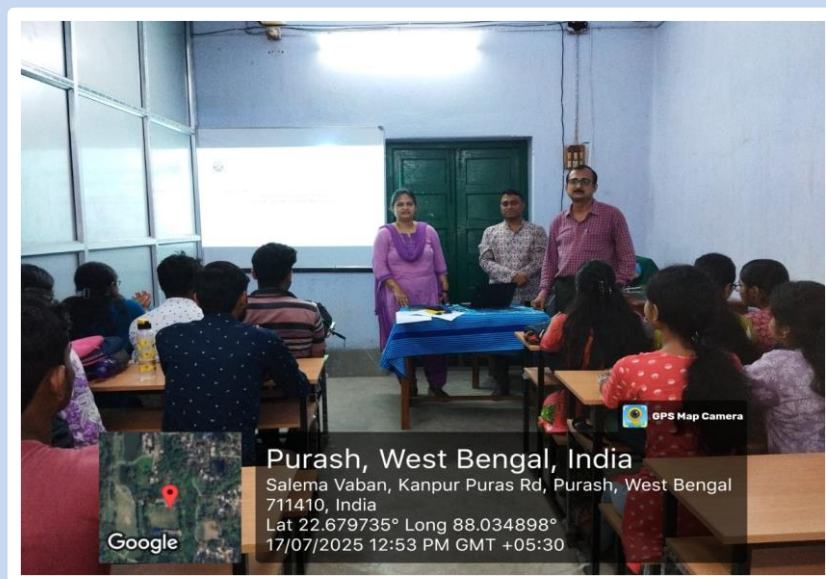
Job Placement Opportunity

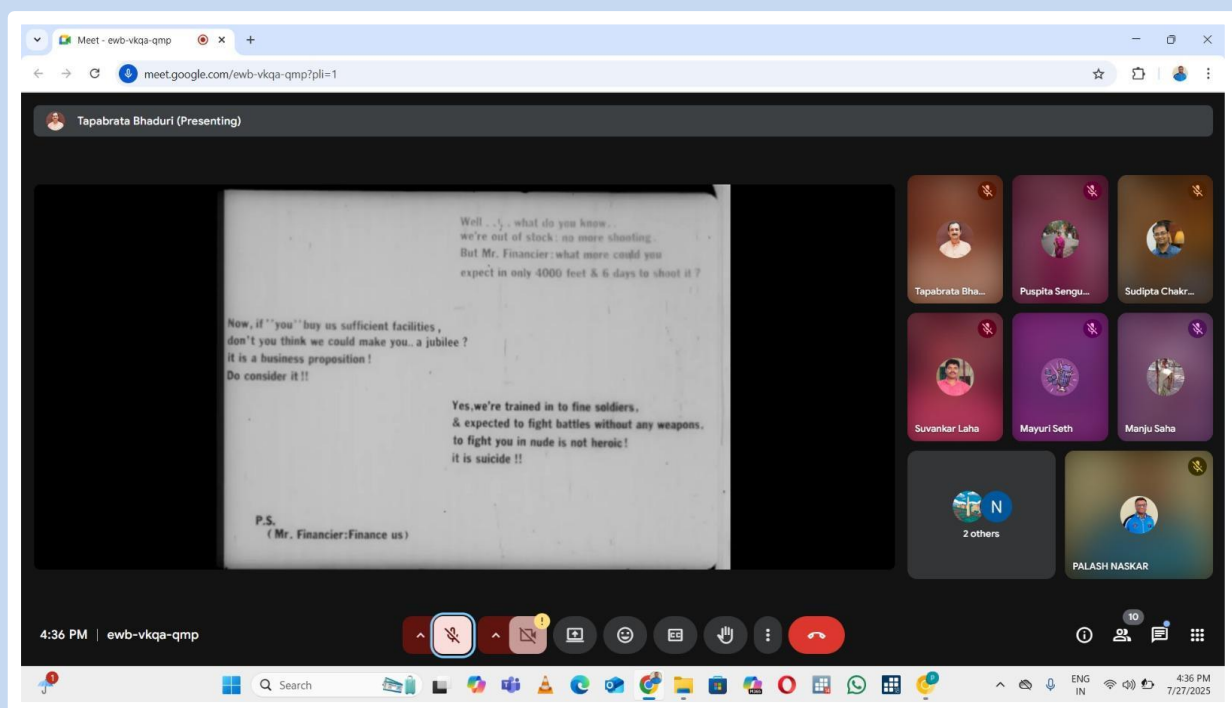
