The Centre for Partition Studies of our college has remained committed to this intellectual pursuit. In this context, a programme titled “FAULTLINES” was organized on 22nd March 2026 at 6:00 PM. This year, we had the privilege of collaborating with Ramakrishna Mission Vidyamandira as we revisited the multiple socio-historical dimensions of Partition. The programme featured three intellectually enriching talks delivered by distinguished resource persons:

## Faculty Seminar: Department of Sanskrit

The Department of Sanskrit organized a Faculty Seminar on 30th March 2026 at 1:30 PM in Room No. 23. Following the inaugural session, Dr. Puspita Sengupta briefly introduced the theme and significance of the seminar.
