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
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Report on 3 days' Online Special Lecture Series Organized by Bengali Department of Purash Kanpur Haridas Nandi Mahavidyalaya

Bengali department of the institution under the aegis of IQAC, organized three special lectures on 17th, 19th & 21st August 2020.

The first topic of discussion was *Now and Then of Bengali Rhyme: Sukumar Roy*. Speaker was Prof. Dr. Pabitra Sarkar. Dr. Sarkar taught very efficiently in the Bengali Department of Jadavpur University for a long time. He was also the Vice Chancellor of Rabindra Bharati University. He has contributed immensely to the development of Bengali literature through his writing.

On August 17, 2020, the work of the meeting started through Google Meet at 4 p.m. The principal of the college, professors of other departments and faculties of other colleges attended the lecture. Numerous students of our college also participated in this discussion very enthusiastically. For this, apart from Google Meet, the help of YouTube was taken. Prof. Sarkar gave an interesting discussion about the similarities and contrasts of rhymes created by various modern poets with rhymes of traditional Bengali folk literature. Rhyme was an oral and spontaneous creation in ancient times, but in modern times it became a conscious creation and began to be expressed in printed letters. Dr. Sarkar illustrated this evolution in an impressive manner by quoting rhymes from ancient and modern eras. Prof. Sarkar's speech was followed by a question-and-answer session.




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On the second day, i.e., August 19, the discussion meeting started at the same time. The topic of the day's speech was - *Mahasweta Devi: A little different perspective*. The speaker was Professor Nandita Basu. Professor Basu was a professor of the Department of Modern Indian Language and Literature at Delhi University. Professor Basu has gone beyond conventional notions about the story of Mahasweta Devi and presented Mahasweta Devi in a new light. In the story of Mahasweta Devi, she has highlighted the greater social identity of women beyond family boundaries. Like the day earlier, Professor Basu's speech was followed by a question-and-answer session.




The third day was August 21. The topic of the day was *Rabindranath's philosophy of environment: in mind and creation*. The speaker was Prof. Debalina Seth. Prof. Seth was the Head of the Bengali Department at Rabindra Bharati University. Professor Seth had discussed in great detail how Rabindranath's environmentalism was reflected in his various works. The extent to which Rabindranath was environmentally conscious is evident in his various activities at Santiniketan. At the end of the discussion, the IQAC convener, Prof. Sharanya Sen, of the English Department of our college, thanked everyone.

The institution had issued certificates for all the professors and students who had participated in this discussion. On behalf of Bengali department sincere efforts had been made to archive the lecture series on its YouTube Channel.

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Report on Gender Sensitization, Mansplaining

Brief description:

The inaugural lecture of the Popular Lecture Series is delivered by the respected IQAC coordinator and HOD of the Department of English, Prof. Saranya Sen on 12th June, 2021, titled as 'Mansplaining'. Prof. Sen has clearly explained the etymology and the meaning of this popular word famed as the word of the year in 2010-11. He dips into the details about how the word containing 'man' is not related to any specific spicy of mankind, rather it is a know-all-attitude of explaining something (typically by a man to woman) in a condescending manner (as if she has no knowledge). He points to the lack of economic and political empowerment of women in India causing the deterioration in Gender Gap Index of India, 2020 at 112 th position in the world and simultaneous increase in the crime rate against women by 7%. As the remedy he urges the audience to get empowered to question each and everything from all respects with the critical consciousness prior to internalizing the idea. Because it is the healthy exchange of dialogues which the attitude of mansplaining fears most.

Outcome:

The whole discussion creates a stir among the audience. A number of students and teachers question their own experience of day-to-day hard realities. A few of the questions asked by the students are as follows: Nandita Senapati [GEO. (H)] asked how she can find herself and take decisions in this omnipresent patriarchal mindset starting from her family to the broader society. In choosing her stream of study she wants to be an air-hostess,

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
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but her family puts the barrier and decides, on behalf of her, to study in a general course which it thought to be safer for her career. Sumit China [English (H)] put the question as whether the precepts/disciplines of our scripture are only to maintain the male dominance or the fear of such-discipline-free women to over-empower men. Riya Mukherjee, a student, expresses her real-life confusion over the chivalrous attitudes shown by the men as if to protect the women and girls, while in getting all their requirements done they always command on the hard labour of the women in the family. All the questions have been dealt by the honorable speaker with care and explained in the language comprehendible to the students.

Brief description:

Workshop on Menstrual Health and Hygiene for the second time is organized by Women Cell to spread awareness. One of the reputed companies like Unicharm has stepped forward to conduct the workshop to improve the health and hygiene of girl students living in remote corners of the state as a part of their social responsibility. Roshnee Bhowmick, CSR Executive, Unicharm discussed about the hygiene practices such as the use of sanitary napkins, washing and cleaning. Girls were given useful information on the correct way of disposing of napkins followed by precautions to be taken during the period. 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

- 3. Dr. Kalyan Rudra, Chairman, West Bengal Pollution Control Board: 'Sorrow of Bengal': Myth or Reality"



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
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Outcome:



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

COVID-19 Pandemic Awareness Activity Carried Out Online By Purash Kanpur Haridas Nandi Mahavidyalaya, Howrah, WB

The world has been challenged with a human-health crisis of the century. The governments and administrators all over the world are making policies and programmes to fight the virus. The doctors and health workers are fighting tooth and nails to save thousands life. Being privileged citizens of the country, the students, staff and teachers of Purash-Kanpur Haridas Nandi Mahavidyalaya tried to contribute with their limited capacity but great enthusiasms. Purash Kanpur Haridas Nandi Mahavidyalaya, Howrah, West Bengal have engaged its students and faculty members in carrying out an important online extension activity to prevent the spread of corona and to build up appropriate COVID-19 preventive behaviours through awareness generation among the students, their family members, relatives and neighbours. Under the leadership of Dr. Chandan Kumar Jana, Principal of the College some faculty members like Prof. Aloka Das, GB member; Dr. Puspita Sengupta, Nodal Officer, AISHE & MGNCRE; Prof. Debanjan Seth, NSS Prog. Officer. Unit -I; Prof. Uttam Das, NSS Prog. Officer Unit -II have supervised the projects. They have been able to engage more than five hundred students and some staff in this noble endeavour during this tiring time using information technology tools and social media. The month-long activities resulted in lesser COVID-19 case report in the localities compared to other parts of the district of Howrah.

OBJECTIVE

- 1. To disseminate available knowledge and information about COVID-19 pandemic
- 2. To help the students learn about preventive measures to curb spread of corona virus
- 3. To make them sincere through preparing masks for themselves and family members
- 4. To make them serious on maintaining social distancing and stay at home

PROGRAMME AND ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

Creation of WhatsApp Groups to disseminate knowledge and information on COVID-19

To make students aware of COVID-19 pandemic and prevent its spreading, two WhatsApp Groups were created namely PKHNM FIGHTS COVID-19 and PKHNM FIGHTS CORONA

for disseminating knowledge and information through texts and video chats. More them five hundred members were present in the groups. Encouraged by the enthusiasms of the students PKHNM Fights Corona group was created after number of members in the PKHNM Fights COVID-19 group exceeded 256.

Besides faculty member, our Principal Sir and Mr. Lokanath Sarkar, BDO of Amta, Howrah, were also present in the groups. Later Ms. Shrayashi Das. Consultant-SAP, MGNCRE was also included in the groups to share our activities.

The student members of the WhatsApp groups were given the tasks of discussing with their family members, relatives and neighbours about the "importance of maintaining social distancing to prevent spread of corona and to stay at home during lockdown". This awareness programme was carried out by students by making phone calls. The contact numbers were submitted to the WhatsApp group for verification by the teachers.

Since at the beginning of COVID-19 Pandemic masks were not easily available in the market. Therefore, the students members were asked to make masks. Most of the student members stitched mask for him/herself and for family members and displayed on the WhatsApp groups. Aarogya-Setu App installed


All the members including teachers and staff were asked to install Aarogya-Setu App on their smartphone and use the same to have his/her own health status related corona infection and other updates and information.


Webinars on COVID-19






Figure 2.: The Flyer of the Webinar on COVID-19 and some screenshots of it




Figure 3: Flyer and a screenshot of the Webinar on "Guidance on Psycho-social skills to Helpers during Pandemic"

To assess status of vaccination against COVID-19 our students have been engaged in an online survey recently (started on 17th July, 2021). More than three hundred students responded through Google form on vaccination status of themselves and their family members and accessibility of the vaccine in their locality. Though all the students are keen to receive the shots only 21% of them have been able to get that. A report was prepared and submitted to Principal Sir for future references and actions.

FUTURE PLAN

It's just a beginning. We look forward to carry on many more programmes and activities for the social cause if COVID-19 pandemic does not stop. More specifically, we have the plan for providing vaccines to all our students and staff. They will be made aware of the ensuing 3rd wave of the pandemic with more dangerous mutants. Willing students would be asked enrolled themselves as COVID-WARRIOR for specific activities.

CONCLUSION

With their knowledge and skill and equipped with information technology tools and social media platforms the students, faculty members have engaged themselves in online extension activities means to generate awareness to mitigate COVID-19 pandemic to save themselves in particular and the society at large.
